

Ms. Shive by Heather Slagle




Miss Decker- Grade 3




Students attend Mrs. Neiman's room on a regular schedule. Team teaching occurs throughout the day.





The ending school year will be a other because Mt. Elementary will official cease to exist with the end country this school year.



A Parent's Commentary on Mount Wolf School Possible Closing

In October, Northeastern School Board Directors reviewed preliminary sketch plans for elementary school renovations, including the conversion of Mount Wolf Elementary into a full day kindergarten center. An existing older portion of Mount Wolf Elementary School facing Maple Street will be torn down and rebuilt. It is planned that the two-story structure will house ll regular kindergarten classes, one developmental kindergarten class, one special educational classroom, and a special education resource center. The district is looking at sending the approximately 180 Mount Wolf Elementary students to nearby Orendorf Elementary School in Manchester.

If Mount Wolf Elementary School closes, this newsletter would no longer be in existence. The Mount Wolf Elementary Scholarship and Mount Wolf Elementary PTO would have to disband. The Mount Wolf Elementary School video and Mount Wolf Elementary jackets would only be memories of a school that no longer is. Students' sense of community identity and roots will be lost as they are bused (at the taxpayers expense). The individual community school "pride", which helps motivate parents to participate more in their children education, will not be as effective in larger elementary schools. In this transient society, children and parents need a neighborhood school that they can call home. Mount Wolf Elementary School should be SAVED.


